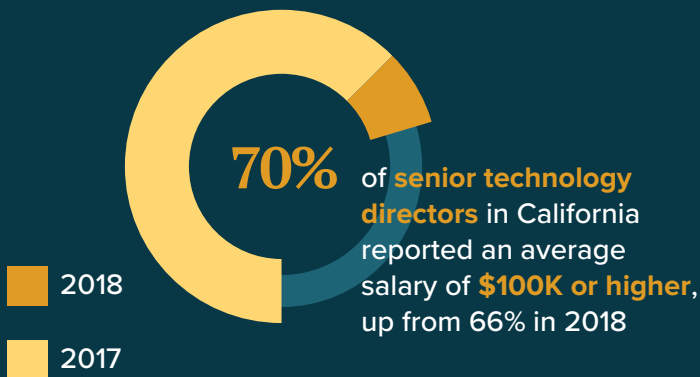

Finding a school that matches my skills and career path

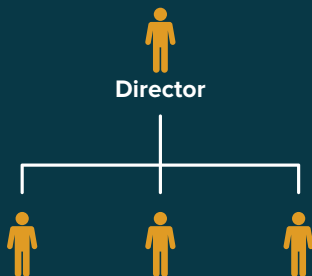

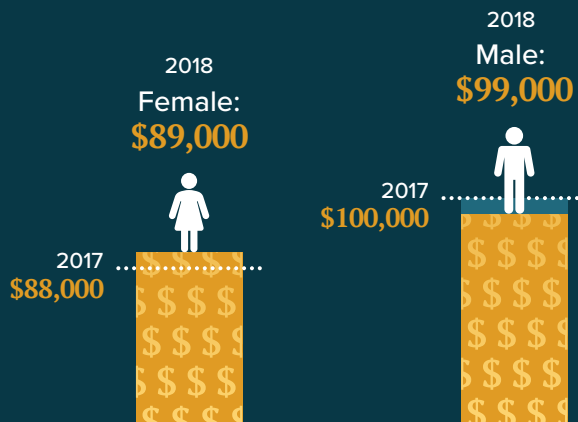

Gender Salary Gap Remains — But Narrows

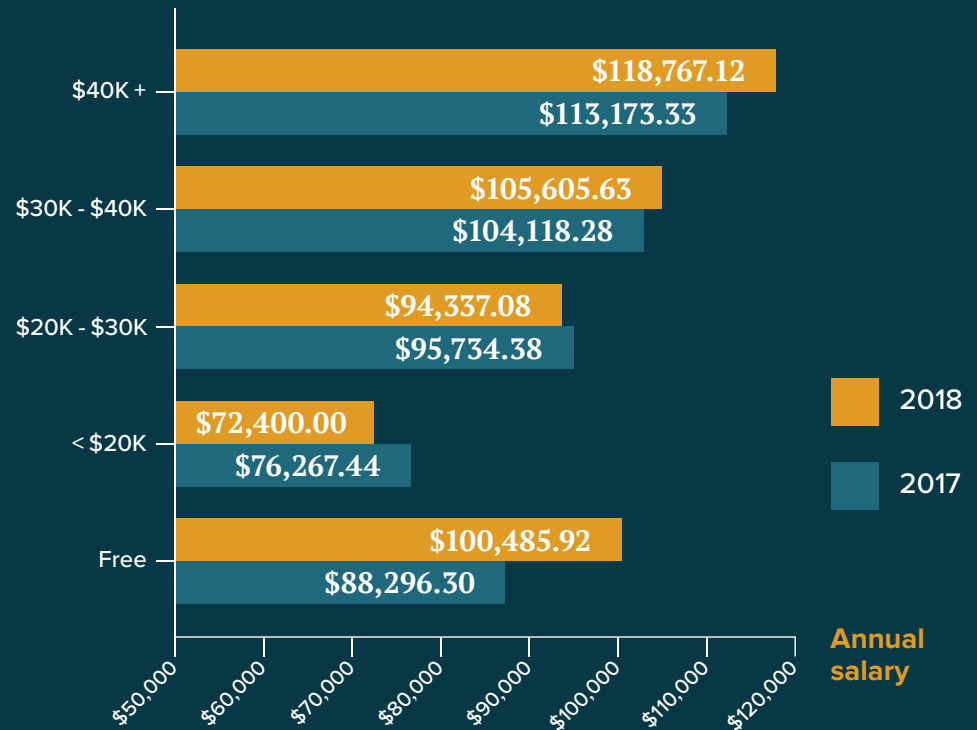


Salaries Contracting at Smaller Institutions

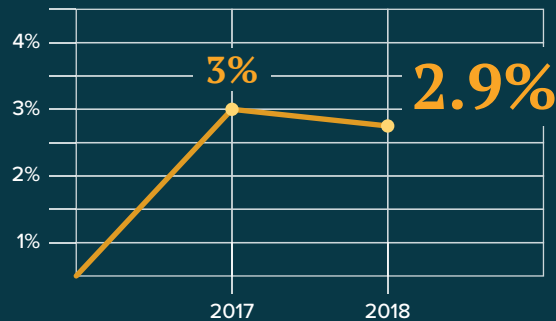
Director-level salaries increased at larger institutions: public schools, universities, and big private schools.

However, at smaller private schools, salaries remained flat or even declined.

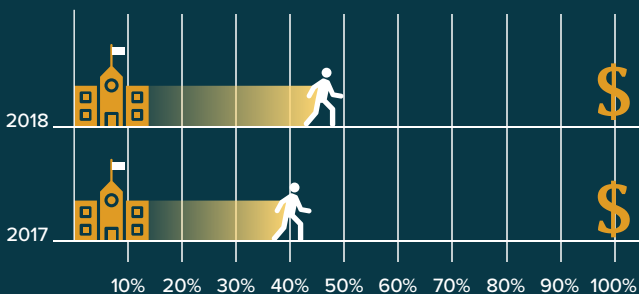
Full-time annual tuition

More People Considering Corporate



Nearly **46%** of ed tech professionals working in schools said they would be **consider a corporate tech** job in the next two years, up from 40% in 2017.

Job Satisfaction Even Higher



In 2018, over **87%** of tech professionals working in schools said they would recommend their job to a friend, up from **72%** in 2017.
