Over the last several years, Awty has seen exceptional growth and as such has been able to invest in a world-class faculty and staff. The largest international day school in the United States, Awty has made a commitment to technology over the last several years: upgrading bandwidth and infrastructure, shifting to Apple devices for faculty, and equipping learning spaces with the best technology. The next Director of IT and Information Systems will be an important leader in helping plan for the campus of the future. This role reports to the Chief Academic Officer (CAO) and works in close partnership with the Director of Educational Technology, who also reports to the CAO.

AWTY'S STRATEGIC VISION

Awty's Strategic Vision consists of three goals:

Goal #1: Be a One-School community, richly international, deeply bilingual, intentionally innovative, culminating in the French Bac or IB diploma.

Goal #2: Secure the facilities and the space needed to support our students, teachers, and programs.

Goal #3: Strengthen Awty's position as the leading school in Houston that makes an international life possible.

AWTY'S HISTORY

Awty was founded in 1956 as a preschool by Mrs. Kathleen "Kay" Awty. In 1978, the school formally merged with the French School of Houston, and soon thereafter purchased the current campus property. In 1984, the school officially became "The Awty International School." In 1981, Awty adopted the FB program as part of its curricula, and in 1987 Awty adopted the IB program.

The ideals established by Mrs. Kay Awty upon her inception of the school are still reflected in the philosophy of our educators today: to establish a supportive, student-centered environment where students can reach their full potential, enriched by diversity across the campus.

To that end, Awty offers rigorous courses based on the curricula of the International Baccalaureate and French Baccalauréat programs. Each program provides an excellent framework for teaching and learning. As a school committed to incorporating the most valuable educational practices, Awty is continually finding ways to have the best of each program benefit all students at all grades.

Dual language immersion opportunities are increasing across the grades so students at all levels can complete their courses in a combination of English, French, or Spanish. Students also have the opportunity to study a third language in Middle School and Upper School.

Our international and diverse community of students and teachers from over 50 countries offers innumerable multicultural encounters and daily lessons in cultural awareness. Our faculty is highly qualified with over 63% holding advanced degrees and they bring a wealth of global experience to the classroom. This further enriches the competence of our students as they prepare to embark on their journey in our ever-changing world.



NEW CAMPUS CENTER

The School has been advancing a facilities master plan for more than a decade; five of the seven buildings in the plan have been completed. The Campus Center is the next step. Three years in the making, this facility will be at the heart of the main campus and will provide support for 21st century teaching and learning, community connections, and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) education. Two spacious new buildings will house modern science labs, classrooms, seminar and collaboration spaces, dining facilities, a library, and a makerspace.

These new academic and social spaces will enhance our educational program and deepen community bonds by providing students, faculty and staff places to gather formally and informally, in large and small groups, indoors and outdoors. This future-proofed space will be flexible and serve multiple purposes to meet the needs of our entire community. Our students will be well prepared for a future we can only imagine.

THREE MAJOR PRIORITIES

Priority #1: Building Community, including a world-class student center, dining for entire main campus and proper lecture hall

Priority #2: 21st Century Teaching and Learning, including a future oriented library, space for innovation and collaboration, flexible spaces and furniture, engaging group work space, and technologically advanced classrooms

Priority #3: STEAM, including a makerspace, cutting edge science and technology labs and cross-collaborative space for STEAM education


STATEMENT ON DIVERSITY

STRUCTURE OF THE ROLE

The next Director of IT and Information Systems (DIIS) will be joining a highly effective model for independent school technology leadership. At Awty instead of having one all-school tech director, there are two technology directors, both reporting to the Chief Academic Officer (CAO): a Director of Educational Technology (DET) and the DIIS. The DIIS oversees the IT and information systems department and its four members: a network manager, senior network technician, technology assistant, and a database administrator. Meanwhile, the DIIS is a crucial member of the Awty innovation team. Working alongside the DET and under the guidance of the CAO, the DIIS helps to set all-school tech strategy, oversee major systems rollouts, and support large-scale technology planning and training.

Location and campus: Awty is comprised of two campus locations in close proximity: a 26-acre main campus for Lower, Middle, and Upper Schools, with dedicated classroom buildings that include science and computer labs, music studios, indoor and outdoor athletic facilities, and dining halls; and, a nearby 5-acre Early Learning Campus for PK3/PS, PK4/MS, Kinder/GS, and 1st grade/CP featuring 26 classrooms, a full gym, and dedicated indoor spaces for art, music, dining, after-school programs, and technology.

SPECIFIC DUTIES

IT Operations

- Oversee and evaluate the deployment of all hardware, software, and systems from various perspectives, including cost-effectiveness; customer satisfaction; compliance; asset management; migration, rollout, and transition; and performance
- Develop and implement the department budget; evaluate internal IT systems for performance, efficiency, and customer satisfaction; and oversee and manage all accounts, contracts and financial issues related to the department
- Ensure IT data security, risk management, disaster recovery and planning processes are in place and receive regular review for currency and adequacy

Data / Systems

- Oversee the maintenance and reliability of the school's enterprise data / systems environment, including major systems such as: SIS, LMS, CMS, financial and accounting, and advancement
- Work with senior leadership and various operational and academic departments to ensure they have the necessary access to, and reporting of, data
- Coordinate technology projects with other departments and outside entities
- Serve as the school's primary project manager for enterprise-wide data transitions

Leadership and Strategy

- Oversee the hiring, supervision, evaluation and growth of all technology staff, and ensure that the department structure supports the school's needs and goals
- Develop and maintain strategic and operational plans for technology that are aligned with departmental needs, school values, and organizational culture
- Lead and direct IT governance, planning, policy development, and procedures, including those for architecture, security, disaster recovery, standards, purchasing hardware and software deployment, and service provision
- Anticipate the needs of diverse constituents, monitoring trends and innovations in the industry and making actionable recommendations
