In July 2015, the Walton Family Foundation announced the appointment of <u>Clayton Marsh</u>, former Deputy Dean of the College at Princeton University, to serve as the founding head of a new independent school in Bentonville, Arkansas. Named in honor of Louise Thaden, a pioneering aviator who was born and raised in Bentonville, the school opened in the fall of 2017 will grow incrementally over the next few years to serve approximately 550-650 students in grades 6-12. The school now seeks a Data Systems Manager. Reporting to the Director of Technology and working closely with the academic Division Heads, the Data Systems Manager will be responsible for the performance, integrity, and security of all Thaden School databases. The Data Systems Manager is charged with curating academic records, constructing student schedules, and supporting the information needs of the entire school community.

Primary Responsibilities

The Data Systems Manager will insure that:

- Data remains consistent across all school databases
- Data is clearly defined
- Users access data concurrently, in a form that suits their needs
- There is provision for data security and recovery control (all data is retrievable in an emergency)

Their responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Understanding the needs of the Thaden community and working collaboratively to establish consistent procedures and data standards
- Assessing the integrity of the existing databases
- Leading any database migrations between platforms or versions
- Collaboratively working with the IT team to ensure the security, safety and consistency of all databases
- Managing access permissions and privileges
- Developing, managing and testing backup and recovery plans
- Oversee the enrollment and registration of all students in Blackbaud
- Working with the Division Heads to maintain all student information including, but not limited to, attendance records, registration forms, schedules, rosters, transcripts, course requests, and other materials
- Overseeing the student information system
- Supporting all administrative data reporting needs
- Creating and managing all student schedules as well as the master schedule
- Working with Director of Admissions to create and maintain incoming student information
- Supporting College Counseling in matters of academic advising, transcripts, and other student records
- Other duties as assigned by the Director of Technology

curiosity, inspire creativity, and invite reflection. The design and construction of the campus will be complete before the school commences its third academic year in the fall of 2019. During its first two academic years (beginning in the fall of 2017), Thaden School operating in a combination of temporary and permanent structures located on a 5-acre portion of its campus.

The school serves students from all parts of the growing and diverse region of Northwest Arkansas, which also includes Rogers, Springdale, Fayetteville, and a number of other townships. With more than 500,000 residents, the region combines a thriving economy with the natural beauty of the Ozarks and a rich variety of cultural and recreational amenities such as the <u>Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art</u>, the <u>Razorback Regional Greenway Trail System</u>, the <u>Scott Family Amazeum</u>, and the <u>Bentonville Film Festival</u>. Northwest Arkansas is also home to the world headquarters of three Fortune 500 companies (Walmart, Tyson Foods, and J.B. Hunt) as well as the <u>University of Arkansas</u>, the flagship campus of the state's higher education system.
