PRIMARY FUNCTION: The Instructional Coach is an experienced teacher in the district responsible for assisting other K-12 teachers to plan and deliver quality learning experiences in English language arts, mathematics or other core academic programs, ELD, instructional technology, or GATE (gifted and talented education). The Instructional Coach advises instructional staff on materials and methods and demonstrates teaching techniques.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Consult with classroom teachers to design effective instruction for English learners and model effective use of instruction for second language learners. *E*
- Facilitate study groups related to English language arts, mathematics or other core subjects, ELD, instructional technology or GATE, as assigned. *E*
- Collaborate with principals, and other coaches to maintain programs in compliance with state and federal regulations. E
- Provide formal and informal professional development for teachers and administrators. *E*
- Participate and advise as a member of District and site-level committees as needed. *E*
- Participate in continuous content and coaching training and demonstrate teaching, coaching and presentation skills. E
