This is a full-time, 10-month position reporting directly to the Director of Electronic Learning and ultimately the Head of School.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Develop and teach computer science classes as assigned – likely Computer Programming and AP Computer Programming. Possibly also teach a middle school enhancement class depending on expertise.
- Coordinate, support, and promote co-curricular and interdisciplinary projects for the school with an emphasis on the utilization of technology in innovative ways
- Teach using student-centered, experiential, and differentiated methods, in line with school philosophies.
- Maintain regular office hours and help sessions to work with students and faculty technology issues as needed during the school day consistent with the policies and procedures of the Electronic Learning Department.
- Participate in department and faculty meetings.
- Demonstrate strong classroom management skills
- Integrate diversity, equity and inclusion work into their work
- Build strong partnerships with families and communicate regularly about student learning and classroom events
- Participate in the planning, development and evaluation of curricula, materials and methodology.
- Maintain expertise in the field through ongoing professional development
- Serve as a faculty advisor to students, engage substantively in the life of the school outside the classroom, collaborate with colleagues, and assume other duties as assigned by the Director of Electronic Learning.
