Montclair Kimberley Academy is an innovative PK–12 independent day school with a strong national reputation and a globally recognized 1:1 Learning program. MKA seeks a Middle School Instructional Technologist starting in the 2023-2024 school year to support and inspire teachers' and students' use and evolving integration of technology in their teaching and learning at its Middle School (grades 4-8). This is a 12-month position.

Instructional Design & Curricular Leadership (Professional Development, Teaching, Instruction & Training):

- Teach or co-teach lessons based on campus curricular needs
- Lead professional development, training, and onboarding for use of technology tools in the classroom
- Stay current on research regarding teaching, learning, and assessment with technology
- Collaborate and communicate with other campus coordinators, librarians, and the Director of Educational Technology to coordinate school-wide technology goals and implementation
- Collaborate with and coach teachers in use of technology for assessing student learning, differentiating instruction, and providing purposeful learning experiences
- Co-plan campus-specific professional development and communication in coordination with Head of Campus, Assistant Head of Campus, other campus administration, and faculty
- Work with other campus Instructional Technologists to guide vision and plan outcomes for the Student Ed Tech leadership group
- Serve as a member of curricular leadership committees including the Academic Programs Committee, Tri-Campus Educational Technology Committee, and the 1:1 Implementation Committee
- Champion a playful approach to instructional technology
- Communicate with parents to provide proactive guidance related to students' technology use

General Support & Account Management:

- Foster a collaborative, generative learning environment in the Tech Center
- Provide basic troubleshooting for faculty and students including drop-in visits to the Tech Center and responses to Help Desk tickets
- Serve as an account co-administrator for online educational resources.
- Communicate program updates with faculty through email and announcements at faculty meetings
- Vet new tech tools for classroom use to determine pedagogical value and adherence to privacy and security protocols
- Assist with annual deployment of technology resources to students, faculty, and staff
- Maintain a basic understanding of deployed hardware resources and operating systems

Campus-Specific Responsibilities:

- Oversee the deployment of new student laptop deployment and training to ensure safe/secure/effective use of laptops
- Attend all grade level and department meetings
- Oversee the Student Ed Tech Leadership Group
- In partnership with faculty and administration, develop and deliver lessons that support digital literacy across the curriculum in grades 4-8
- Teach 4th grade "Tech Bytes" course to introduce students to core technology competencies
