BROWNING PHILOSOPHY OF LEARNING

He will develop the disposition not only to respond to others' questions, but also the ability to craft questions of his own, questions that will drive his class's process of inquiry. Through this activity, the boys are likewise challenged to ask similar searching questions of themselves. It is through this questioning that they come to understand their identities as intellectual and moral agents, and recognize the opportunities they have to develop and refine their senses of self and character. In reflecting upon the bigger, essential questions that arise from their self-examination and academic work alike, Browning boys are inspired to seek a deeper level of understanding and to build a sense of purpose that will engage their passions and skills in the service of the world beyond themselves.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Browning is looking for a Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) Teacher for the 2022-2023 academic year. The position is expected to begin orientation on August 15, 2022 (*tentative date*).

Key Responsibilities

Teachers are responsible for building strong relationships with students and delivering the content and curriculum of the Browning program. Successful teachers believe in and desire the growth of all their students and have a passion for their subject matter and for the art, craft, and science of pedagogy. Ultimately, teachers are responsible for the most important work of our School -- knowing our boys and teaching them well. Among other things, they are tasked with:

- 1. Teaching CSE courses in grades 5 to 9
- 2. Collaborating with teachers to explore innovative teaching methods and refine curriculum
- 3. Supporting teachers with educational technology and the use of Canvas

- 4. Developing and implementing an inspiring curriculum in conjunction with department members
- 5. Creating strong relationships with students built on Browning's core values of honesty, dignity, curiosity, and purpose
- 6. Collaborating as a professional, collegial, and inspirational member of the department
- 7. Participating in professional development to grow the self, department, and school
- 8. Communicating with families about curricular and student matters
- 9. Advising a group of students in the Middle School
- 10. Heartily contributing to the school community

Key Competencies

In general, successful members of the Browning faculty are:

- *Champions of boys* -- They believe in and love the expansive potential in boys.
- Relationship-oriented -- They actively build meaningful relationships with students and families.
- *Purpose-driven* -- They are inquiry-minded, curious and resourceful in finding solutions and growth opportunities.
- Justice-seeking -- They seek to address students and their needs with an equity-oriented and antiracist lens and engage in the deep work of equity in the classroom and school community.
- *Can-do collaborators* -- They seek collaboration and listen deeply to others, and they believe that a can-do attitude allows a team to accomplish more.

A successful CSE teacher will collaborate well with others, delight in the content and pedagogy of teaching computer science and engineering, enjoy supporting teachers, maintain a high level of connection to and belief in the students, and contribute meaningfully to meeting Browning's diversity and equity goals, as well as other strategic plans and goals. Communicating clearly and consistently with students, families, and fellow department members is of the utmost importance.
