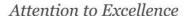

Rundle College Society is seeking a Teacher / Technology Integrator to join the Collett Primary / Elementary school for a temporary term.

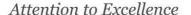
Position:

The Teacher / Technology integrator is responsible for providing technology leadership for faculty and staff.

- Facilitate the creation of technology-based lesson plans and curricula.
- Provide hands-on assistance with equipment and basic troubleshooting.
- Collaborate with faculty to develop long-term technology goals and vision.
- Oversee and manage the learning management system and collaboration platform.
- Perform basic troubleshooting, scheduling and management of PowerSchool.
- Develop, and teach and/or team teach digital responsibility / digital citizenship material.
- Teach students in a variety of technological contexts and levels in the K 6 programs.
- Participate in the comprehensive co-curricular program at Rundle College Collett School.
- Other duties as assigned by the Principals.
