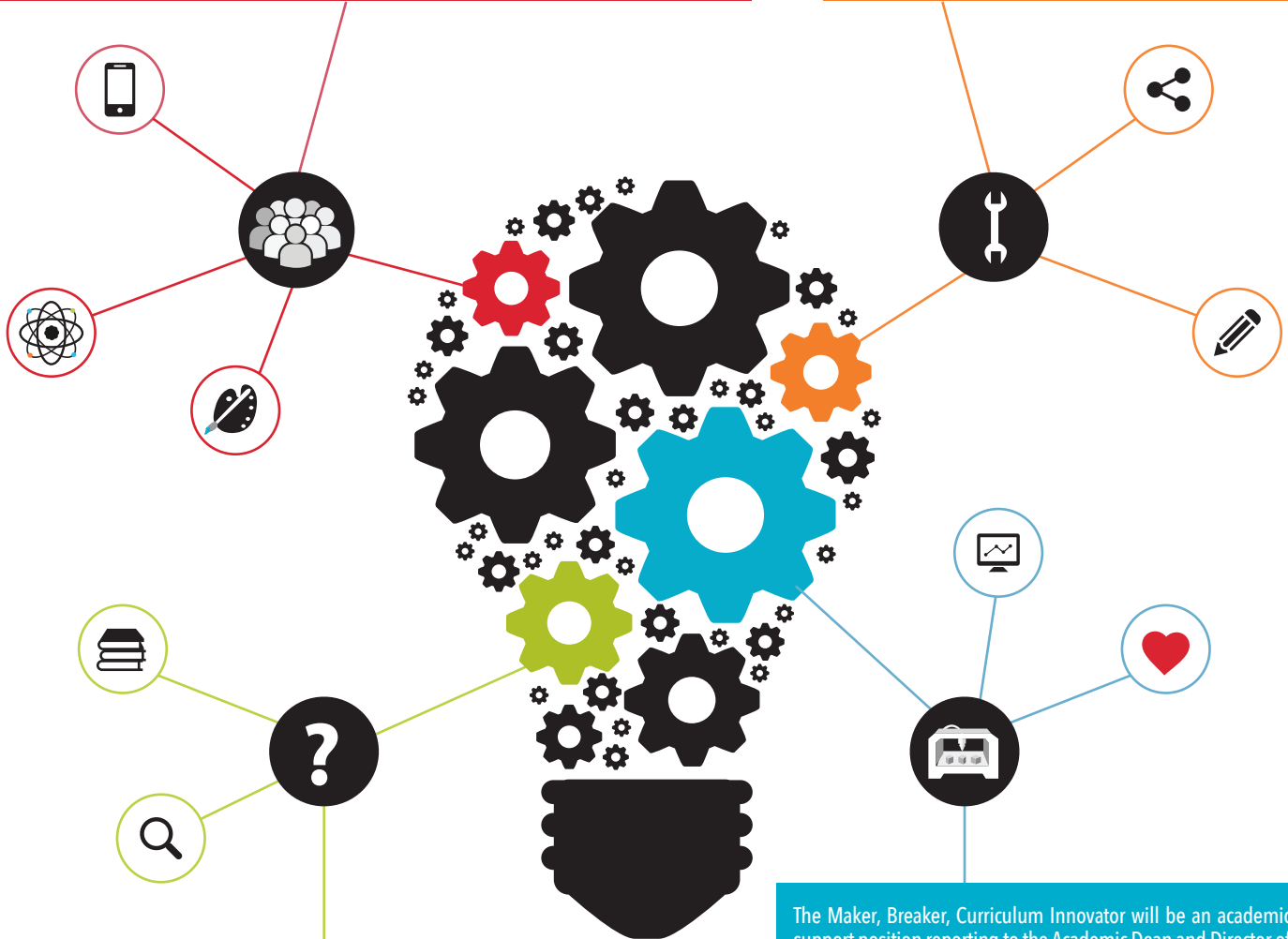


MAKER, BREAKER, CURRICULUM INNOVATOR
